ANY of our readers may know that, before beginning a career as a trainer, Mark graduated with a degree in Veterinary Medicine from the University of Glasgow, and then embarked upon a spell in practice as a vet, prior to the acquisition of his first racing yard at Bank End Stables in Lincolnshire. Mark and Deirdre's eldest son, Charlie, has been interested in all aspects of racing since, as he puts it in this month's Spotlight, 'day zero'. Charlie chose to follow in his father's footsteps by attending the

Glasgow Vet School and he is now in his final year. He's a familiar face on our racecourses as he has been saddling for MJR for some years, and also to television viewers, having been a guest on Channel 4's The Morning Line on a number of occasions as well as being interviewed during racing. A sports addict, he is interested in a variety of sports, and plays rugby for his university team and Wensleydale, his local team. In his lighter days he used to Point-to-Point and rode a number of winners at several northern courses.

How, and when, were you introduced to horseracing? On Day 0....I didn't have much choice in the matter! I learned to read off the back of the Racing Post! ("Actually," Mark recalls,

If you could choose any other career, what would it be? I would have done something finance-related in the City.

What is your favourite drink? Well, given the amount of Diet Coke Dad and I drink between us they should probably sponsor the yard. Other than that a pint of Fosters will do.


Who has had the biggest influence on vour life? My dad.
